**Ages: 18+**, can be at any point in their cancer journey (in treatment or out of treatment for many years).

## First Descents

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First Descents provides life-changing [outdoor adventures](#) for young adults impacted by cancer and other health conditions. These programs teach participants to climb, paddle and surf beyond their diagnosis, giving them the chance to reclaim their lives and connect with others who have a similar diagnosis.

## Project Koru

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[Camp Koru](#) is a week-long adventure therapy camp to help young adult cancer survivors find healing and renewal through outdoor experiences. The camp and activities are all free, but participants must pay for their travel to and from camp.

[This is Life Retreat](#) is a three-day workshop series for young adult survivors to develop a robust toolkit of skills for managing day to day life with, and after cancer.

## SeriousFun Children's Network

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SeriousFun Children's Network [camps](#) feature a diverse range of inclusive programs such as family weekends, sibling camp, winter adaptive weekends, bereavement camp and week-long residential camps.

## True North Treks

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True North Treks provides backpacking and canoeing [excursions](#) for groups of young adult cancer survivors and caregivers where they can connect with nature and connect with peers who have been through similar experiences. The group also provides training and practice in mindfulness meditation and yoga.

## Yoga4Cancer

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Yoga4Cancer is an evidence-informed [oncology yoga](#) method tailored to address the specific physical and emotional needs left by cancer and its treatment. The approach matches breath and movement to stimulate the immune system, improve flexibility & strength, reduce anxiety and boost overall well-being.





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# Self-Esteem

The [Hugs U Wear](#) provides 100 percent human hair, custom-made wigs to children suffering from a loss of self-esteem due to treatment-induced hair loss.

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Look Good Feel Better offers group and virtual sessions that teach [beauty techniques](#) to help people with cancer face their diagnosis with greater confidence.

The organization also has a program for [teens with cancer](#) which provides information on how to deal with issues such as skin changes, hair loss, nutrition, fitness and how to keep your social life on track while going through treatment.
